Dear Families,

Year 13 Introduction and Expectations

As the students embark on their final year at Sandringham School, I would like to reintroduce myself as the Year 13 Performance Director and take this opportunity to share some important information.

Dress code: We expect our students to dress in a way that is suitable for a professional environment. Please review the [Sixth Form Dress Code](#) carefully. If you have any questions, please contact me directly.

Code of Conduct: We have very high expectations of the behaviour and conduct of our students, and expect our students to hold themselves to this very standard. Please review the [Sixth Form Code of Conduct](#) which provides more detail.

Attendance: We expect our students to make every effort to both attend school every day and arrive promptly. Please review the [Sixth Form Attendance Policy](#) which provides detail of our attendance expectations.

Registration: Morning registration starts each morning at **8.30am and lasts until 8.50am**. Registration is an important part of the day and is compulsory for all students.

Assemblies: Students in Year 13 will not have a regular weekly assembly (as they did in Year 12). Instead, we will hold assemblies at key points in the year which will be used to share key messages, careers and futures guidance, and opportunities. We will communicate the dates to our students well in advance.

Study sessions: All students will have a number of study sessions allocated on their timetable to complete home learning, consolidation and revision. As with their subject lessons, these are compulsory sessions.

Personal Development: All students will continue to have one hour of Personal Development (PSHE) on their timetable: this is a compulsory subject which will focus on key aspects of personal, social and emotional development.

Lunch: Students have the option to leave the school site to take their lunch break elsewhere, however, students must not bring food back onto the school site. Students must return to school promptly for the start of session 5.

Our Sixth Form cafe is open from 8.30am until 1.45pm each day selling a variety of hot and cold drinks and food. The school canteen is also available for students to purchase food or drink at break and lunch. All venues across the school site operate a cashless catering system.

Mobile phones: Sandringham School is a **phone-free environment** and mobile phones should not be seen at any point during the school day.

Sixth Formers are permitted **discretionary use** of their mobile phone (e.g. to book a GP appointment or contact their employer) at either break or lunchtime, within the confines of the Sixth Form Centre. Using a mobile phone at any other time or in any other location will result in either a sanction or a confiscation of the phone, in-line with the school Behaviour Policy.

Identification: All Sixth Form students have an **ID badge and lanyard** that allows them access to and from the site. The ID badge and lanyard are a crucial element of our safeguarding policy and must be worn at all times.

Attendance and absence: We expect full attendance for all lessons and study sessions. If your child is unable to attend due to illness, a parent / carer must ring the school on **01727 799564** or email 6thformattendance@sandringham.aetrust.uk

Bursary: Students are able to apply for a Post-16 Bursary, which is used to help fund the cost of equipment, textbooks and resources required for specific courses. For more information about eligibility, please read our [Sixth Form Bursary Guidance](#). If you think you may be eligible, please complete a Bursary Application Form and return it to the Sixth Form by **Friday 11th September**.

Year 13 Trial Exams: Students will sit the next round of in school examinations over a two-week exam period. These will run between **Wednesday 6th - Tuesday 19th January 2027**. Students will be on study leave during this time.

Parent Consultation Evening: Our Year 13 PTC will be held on **Tuesday 9th February 2027** - this will provide a chance for parents / carers to meet with subject teachers and discuss the Year 13 trial exams.

Finally, there is a **Parent Information Evening** at school on **Tuesday 15th September at 5.30pm** which we will use to run through some key information about the final year of the Sixth Form.

All information about the Sixth Form, including the Sixth Form Handbook, Dress Code, Code of Conduct, and Attendance Policy, is available on the Sixth Form section of the Sandringham School website.
